GEORGIA PROGRAMS TO HELP YOU THIS WINTER

For anyone who may benefit, there are state and local resources available to support weatherization and energy costs: Georgia Weatherization Assistance Program, served by the Tallatoona Community Action Partnership: (<https://tallatoonacap.org/wx/>) Weatherization means they will assess your home (both structure and appliances) for energy loss or waste. If they find inefficiencies, they'll take measures to correct the issues – by installing air sealing, insulation, and energy-saving appliances – using solutions that have the highest savings-to-investment ratios.

H.E.A.T. (Heating Energy Assistance Team) (www.heatga.org) H.E.A.T. works with the Georgia Division of Family and Children Services (DFCS) to distribute natural gas assistance funds through CAAs. H.E.A.T. has a few assistance programs that each provide up to \$350 of funding towards past due heating bills for customers.

LIHEAP (Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program) (www.facaa.org/programs/liheap-2) A federally funded energy assistance program that helps low and fixed-income families meet their energy needs during the heating season by providing up to \$400 of non-crisis funding towards heating bills each winter. Georgia Power Programs & Rebates (<https://www.georgiapower.com/residential/save-money-and-energy.html>) include the Energy Assistance for Savings and Efficiency Program, Home Energy Improvement Program (individual and whole improvement rebates), and Hope Works (free home energy savings improvements for those that qualify). They provide a number of rebates and incentives from LED Light Bulbs, Air Sealing, to Duct Sealing, and EV Charger Installation Rebates.

Tuesday, December 12th, 2023, 7p. Meeting conducted by Marinangeles Gutierrez Rivera. Minutes by Lucy Perkins. Location: Cabbagetown Community Center.

2. Atlanta Police Department Updates - Lt. Butler

Motor vehicle theft is up but mostly from Kias and Hyundais. Violent crime is down. People stealing from the cars is down. Zone Six is doing well. Homicide on Ponce was an isolated incident.

3. Review and Approval of October Minutes

Review of prior minutes. Motion to accept minutes - approved.

4. City of Atlanta Council Person - Council Person Liliana Bakhtiari, Patrick Husbands representing.

Tye and Gaskill all-way stop has gone through - 60-90 business days for install. 260 Estoria construction - stuff on sidewalk, lanes were closed with no one directing traffic, which is a violation - please report when seen. Q: Short term rental ordinance going into effect at end of year? Is that true? A: Deadline has been moved so many times - not sure. Register short term rentals now but enforcement hasn't kicked in yet. Q: Left turn light at tunnel? - DOT is slow but they've put in an inquiry. Please provide feedback on the DOT website.

5. Vice-President Report - Marinangeles Gutierrez

Transportation Committee Updates + Tye Stop Sign: Best way to get things done is to reach out to DOT directly: Atlanta DOT website, submit comment on website or on social media. Update on Pearl Street traffic calming - going through procurement; 1st quarter of 2024 to be completed. An additional piece of sidewalk is included - concrete, not brick!

Q: Where is hump? A: Still at top of hill. Stop sign at Gaskill and Tye. Other stop signs were installed. Gaskill, Fulton Terrace, and Estoria. Requested curb cuts at Tye and Wylie. GDOT has reached out to us about Memorial Drive project. Road diet (reduction of lanes) and installation of bike lane. They want to talk to us to answer questions. Look for them at Feb. or March meeting. There will be a crosswalk from here to Taco Town, but don't know where. CNIA Membership Campaign: Open Positions include Communications Chair, Transportation Committee Chair, and other Member At-Large positions.



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


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C'town Chows: 2024 Food Trends

LET'S SLOW DOWN ON BELTLINE RAIL

Last month, Brandon Sutton wrote a thoughtful piece supporting light rail on the Beltline. Today, I'll present an opposing view and encourage civil dialogue on this sensitive topic.

First, let's agree on what we are debating. The only light rail project currently being designed and debated is the Eastside Beltline project that expands the Streetcar from downtown to Ponce City Market. So when people say "Beltline light rail," they are

really saying "Eastside Beltline Streetcar." That's what we should call it to avoid confusion. However, Streetcar on the entire Beltline will cost over \$3B and take decades, so we can't take this first step lightly.

Please consider:

1. Plans can change. Yes, light rail was a part of Ryan Gravel's 1999 thesis. Yes, Eastside Beltline Streetcar was included in the 2016 MARTA tax referendum along with DOZENS of other projects. Those are historic facts, but not justifications to move forward. In fact, the initial argument for Beltline Streetcar was that it was needed to spur development, but plenty of development happened anyway! So let's agree to evaluate the Streetcar on its merits today. Atlanta has many transit needs... Why should this one be prioritized?

2. Eastside Beltline Streetcar is a questionable use of resources. In 2022, Eastside Beltline Streetcar was projected to cost up to \$275M. That's for only 2.3 miles of transit! Who among us would be willing to tell residents in disadvantaged, under-invested neighborhoods that a Streetcar expansion into relatively affluent, developed areas is more valuable than any one of the dozens of other projects in the 2016 MARTA plan? Why can't we finish the Beltline trail first?

3. The Streetcar is not an effective mass transit solution. The Streetcar is slow, and access will be limited with only THREE stations planned for the Eastside Beltline. When Gravel wrote his thesis in 1999, Atlanta didn't have convenient transportation for hire. If it's hot or raining, do you really think someone would commute to a Streetcar station, wait, crawl along the Beltline, then commute from their destination to/from their job? Or do you think they'll just drive themselves, or use their Uber app and hire a car, scooter, or e-bike?

4. Light rail eliminates greenspace and disrupts small businesses. Dual-track Streetcar requires nearly 40 feet of right of way and offers limited access points. Say goodbye to the beautiful tree canopy between the pedestrian trail and the edge of the corridor (thank you for your hard work, Trees Atlanta!), say hello to concrete, fences, walls, tracks, and access restrictions. Less greenspace means more heat, and less access means more congestion. Meanwhile, small businesses along the Beltline will suffer from YEARS of disruption, some might not be able to survive.

Thank you for reading! I'd be happy to discuss these points with an open mind. I know my Cabbagetown neighbors care as much about this city and its people as I do.



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



DYLAN INSPIRES A NEW GENERATION

Across the internet, it is impossible to find a consensus on what the purpose of art is. Some will tell you the purpose is to evoke emotions within the viewer. Some will say that art is a vehicle for social change, some think that its only purpose is to "be enjoyed".

Because there's no right answer, I have no reservation on telling you what I think.

I believe that art is meant to give us insight. Whether that insight be explicit

or implicit, about the creator or a subject, convoluted or simple, works of art in my opinion live or die based on their capacity to give an accurate and deep understanding of a person or thing.

*A piece of art that wildly succeeds on these grounds is Bob Dylan's 1966 album **Blonde on Blonde**. Through its psychedelic organ and guitar, earsplitting harmonica, and its lyrics, tuned to perfection by the greatest poet/songwriter of all time, Blonde on Blonde gives its listener insight into what it means to be a young man. I'd like to take you through some of the many fantastic songs on the record and identify how they express a young man's relationship with women, his burgeoning creativity, and the sheer joy that comes from being free.*

The largest theme that persists throughout the record is Dylan's interaction with women.

Pledging my time, the second track, is the first to highlight Dylan's selfish yet common take on relationships of men his age. Right from the outset we can tell that Dylan's conception of love and dating isn't fully developed. The chorus of the song goes *"I'm pledging my time to you, hoping you'll come through too"*. This way of justifying spending time with a partner feels transactional. Dylan is essentially saying "sure I'll spend my time on you as long as there's something (presumably sexual) in it for me". This lack of commitment and general disposability of romantic interests is further shown in the line *"Come with me baby - I'll take you where you want to go - and if it don't work out - you'll be the first to know."* In this song, women are temporary objects of pleasure able to cast out if they aren't gratifying.

Some of this depravity is exacerbated by the culture of the 60's but some of it is truly a reflection of how young single men in this stage of their lives think about women. The interesting thing is, the ideology presented in this song is at odds with other more traditional love ballads showing that Dylan also has a longing for genuine connection - much like most men that engage frequently in promiscuous acts with lots of women - however, the freedom of being single and untethered usually trumps the desire for real intimacy at this stage in life.

Visions of Johanna, considered to be one of Dylan's greatest works, is a synthesis of these two ideas. The story is a love triangle between Dylan, Louise, and the ephemeral Johanna. The notion that women are objects of pleasure to be used and disposed of is represented by Louise, Dylan's girlfriend, who is more of a tool to him than a person. He writes *"she's alright, she's just near"* admitting that the only reason he associates with her is that it's convenient. His tone shifts however when referring to Johanna, going as far to refer to her as Madonna, and a bird that's flown her now corroding cage. He tells us that he can feel Johanna's fleeting essence in Louise and that his infatuation with Johanna has utterly consumed him with the masterfully written line *"the ghost of electricity howls in the bones of her face - and these visions of Johanna have now taken my place."* Dylan - like myself - and all of you, is a man of multitudes, capable of oxymoronic behavior and rampant paradox at the hands of love.

The last noteworthy track that dives into Dylan's interaction with women is "Just Like a Woman", which has simultaneously garnered immense amounts of praise because it's just plain beautiful to

listen to but also tons of criticism for its overt misogyny. It's a breakup song that forgoes the typical personal criticism of a disgruntled lover, for sweeping generalizations about women and their tendencies to wrong men. Here's the final chorus: *"You fake just like a woman - yeah you make love just like a woman, you ache just like a woman, but you break just like a little girl."* The irony in calling the target of his rage "a little girl" is that blindly blaming the other party for the failure of the relationship and taking no responsibility is highly immature, almost like something a little boy would do.

This is my undisputed favorite song on the album because it feels so human.

It makes no attempt to mask the toxic

cocktail of anger and sadness that comes along with a break-up and portrays the rash, harsh, underthought nature of our words in situations that evoke heavy emotions.

The second theme expressed in droves on the album is just the joy of being free. This motif is far easier to identify in the instrumentation of the songs rather than the lyrics. Understanding the context of this however requires a knowledge of the album's conception and Dylan's work prior to 1966.

Dylan, the spokesperson for the cultural revolution had become overwhelmed with his role as folk music's messiah. He was done being a figurehead, done playing protest anthems with the same three chords. Done pretending to be something he wasn't.

Continued from previous page. On the album preceding **Blonde on Blonde**, Dylan finally broke the chains that bound him by releasing **Highway 61: Revisited**, a rock-n-roll record front to back. In doing so Dylan alienated many of his original fans but in expanding his sound, converted far more fans than he lost.

Because of Highway 61's high sales, Dylan was given almost complete creative freedom on **Blonde on Blonde** and the results speak for themselves. The tracks that lean into pure rock and folk rock ooze pure elation. The screeching guitar on **Obviously Five Believers** sounds like fun and angst, the organ bellows that accompany the chorus on **Sooner or Later** radiate a lust for life more intense than any other sound I've ever experienced. This unadulterated joy at being unshackled from one's past is again not specific to Dylan either. Coming to college like most do and not feeling like you're at the mercy of parents or rules is a similar experience, and in my personal experience results in the same euphoria that Dylan found in gaining the freedom to make the music he dreamed of making.

Finally Blonde on Blonde presents unorthodox creativity that can only be produced in the time of one's life between childhood and full immersion into adulthood. These worlds fuse on the album and leave us with writing more superb than classically trained poets but in a format that is so abstract that it's easy to wonder if there was any thought put into them at all. I lovingly refer to this crop of tracks as "the nonsense songs" because to my knowledge they aren't about anything. They don't have a connecting narrative, it's just music with words to it that's fun to listen to. One of these songs, **"Stuck Inside of Mobile"** jumps from Shakespeare speaking to a french girl, to a senator handing out tickets to his son's wedding, to dancing with Ruthie in her honky tonk lagoon. I'm not going to pretend that I know what a honky tonk lagoon is or why a dead playwright is conversing in French, but I think it's beautiful regardless. These songs are reasonless passion shoved in a unique presentable package of words and rhymes. If you're curious how this extends to the average young man then I ask you this: What else would you call a college kid trying to discover himself other than reasonless passion shoved in a unique, presentable, package of flesh, and thoughts.

The reason I love Blonde on Blonde is because it's so authentic. Nowadays, media seems only to succeed in the mainstream by being based upon vanity and materialism. We've correlated fame and success and happiness with money and cars and elegantly embellished watches. **Blonde on Blonde** is so inspiring and different because instead of making its listener feel inferior, it embraces genuine passion for things we care about, it relishes in the exuberance of youth, it doesn't shy away from individual character flaws; It's an authentic examination and celebration of the ups and downs and the rights and wrongs that come along with being a man stepping into the rest of his life. **Blonde on Blonde** has been described as "quintessential Bob Dylan". I'd argue the **Blonde on Blonde** is quintessential humanity.

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
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CANINES OF CTOWN: SHERMAN

Katie: Hi! So, this must be Sherman!

Brandon: Yes!

Katie: I heard that he is new to Ctown. Let's start with how you got him.

Brandon: Well, you met Lady [Lady was Stevie's dog that lived with Stevie & Brandon]. Her life was truly a beautiful

experience. She wasn't technically my dog, but she was still very special to me. There was something about the energy she brought to my life that I really appreciated. I had been considering adopting a senior or older dog from a shelter for a while. Then, right before Thanksgiving, I went on the shelter website for Fulton, and within minutes, I had 20 tabs open.

Katie: That's a dangerous place.

Brandon: Oh my god. I mean, there's just so many. It's overwhelming. I submitted inquiries on two dogs, and Sherman was one of them. He was in a foster home in Grant Park, like five minutes away. When I went to meet him I walked in, and I was like, "Oh my." It was instant; just his demeanor, his temperament. He's super chill. So, we went for a walk, and I knew that there was a good connection, but I was nervous to take him away from the little boys who are part of the foster family.

Katie: Ah!

Brandon: The foster mom was like, "No, no. The boys know that the faster we find a home for Sherman, the faster we can get another dog out of the shelter." And that just was like, "Holy shit, these are amazing people." First of all, that they're doing that and that they're teaching their kids great values.

Katie: Well, he definitely ended up in a great home.

Brandon: I like to think so.

Katie: How is the adjustment going?

Brandon: Good! We've really bonded. He had a growth on his leg that I knew needed to be addressed. When I took him to get the growth removed, he was wearing the cone. I was like, "Oh god. This is awful." Long story short, I was sleeping on the couch so I could be next to him, so he didn't have to have the cone on. I trusted that he wouldn't mess with it if he was right there with me. So I think that really solidified our bond.

Katie: That's sweet!

Brandon: He seems really appreciative. I'm obviously very appreciative. It's a beautiful connection that, you know, there's something about that process that's just super, super sweet.

Katie: That's really special.

Brandon: Yeah, he is really great! The only lingering thing is his reactivity with other dogs, and it's hit or miss. Elevators are the biggest concern because it's a tight area, and all of a sudden, the doors open, and there are dogs. Generally, out on walks, he's been doing a whole lot better. I have been working with him on it. During walks in Cabbagetown Park, if he reacts, I correct him quickly and reward him when he calms down. He has shown significant progress!

Katie: Good for him! Have you had to take the stairs yet with him?

Brandon: I about flipped out when they said the elevator wasn't working an hour ago.

He is the Executive Director of Atmospherics... always keeping the lighting, music, temperature, and bonfires at Milltown Tavern, Absolutely perfect.



Historic Oakland Foundation and the City of Atlanta Department of Parks and Recreation have announced that Oakland Cemetery will temporarily close to the public for the month of January 2024 so that paving and infrastructure projects may be completed.



Historic Oakland Foundation's Museum Store will also close in January. Both the Cemetery and the Museum Store are expected to re-open to the public on February 1. Information on the closure and reopening can be found at oaklandcemetery.com.

These projects are made possible through funds from the City of Atlanta's 2022 Move Atlanta Forward infrastructure bond. The City is repaving nearly two miles of roads at Oakland, replacing failing water lines, installing irrigation for Oakland's gardens, improving drainage and soil stability, and repairing gutters.

This major accessibility improvement at Oakland would not be possible without the support of our partners in the Department of Parks and Recreation and the City Council, in recognition of the Cemetery's importance as a vibrant place for visitors and neighbors alike.


JenChan's explains this charge on every bill and on every menu.
